Atlanta Chamber Players founder and Artistic Managing Director Paula Peace has announced her retirement effective in early 2015. Paula Peace has led the organization for 38 seasons to a preeminent position in the Atlanta area music scene. During her tenure the group has performed in more than 250 cities in the US, Europe and Mexico and has premiered more than 125 chamber works.

Through her vision and leadership the ACP creates and presents chamber music to the very highest levels of acclaim. The Board has been working with Paula for more than two years to prepare for this moment and we are sure that her legacy can be continued for at least another 38 years.”
